



The New Brunswick Arts Board is an arm's length arts funding agency with a legislated mandate to facilitate and promote the creation of art as well as administering funding programs for professional artists in the province.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Assists artists wishing to enhance their practice through travel, study and promotion.

You can apply to four separate components:

- 1) Arts by Invitation - up to \$2,000 for travel and accommodation
- 2) Artist in Residence - up to \$3,000 per month (3 months or less) plus up to \$1,000 for travel
- 3) Professional Development - \$1,500 for part-time studies or mentorship or \$2,500 for full-time studies
- 4) Professionalization & Promotion - up to \$1,500 for professional services to enhance visibility and dissemination of the artist's works

(6 Deadlines: 1st of May, Jul., Sept., Nov., Jan., March)



ARTS SCHOLARSHIPS

Supports students who demonstrate exceptional talent and potential, and who plan to pursue a career in the arts. Awards are \$2,500 for full-time or \$1,000 for part time or short-term studies.

(Deadline: Feb. 1st)

CREATIVE RESIDENCIES

Supports artists pursuing residencies in designated locations (please see artsnb.ca for an up-to-date list). Provides up to \$3,000 per month (for 1 to 3 months) plus up to \$1000 for travel.

(Deadline: Feb. 1st)

ARTIST IN RESIDENCE

Open to arts organizations and institutions that wish to host professional artists. The aim of this program is to facilitate exchange and collaboration between organizations, invited artists, partners and the public. Visit our website for details.

(Deadline: Feb. 1st)

CREATION

Provides assistance for the exploration, development and execution of creative projects. Three levels of funding are available, depending on the experience level of the artist:

- **Category A** (senior) - \$16,500 max.
- **Category B** (mid-career) - \$11,000 max.
- **Category C** (emerging) - \$5,500 max.

(2 Deadlines: Apr. 1st & Oct. 1st)



DOCUMENTATION

Offers up to \$8,500 to conduct research and produce documentation that contributes to theoretical or critical discourse into the arts. Includes not only writing, but also other forms of documentation, such as audio, video, and multimedia.

(2 Deadlines: Apr. 1st & Oct. 1st)

EQUINOX

Provides up to \$5,000 to Indigenous artists, curators, collectives and organizations to support creative projects, production and presentation, professional development, and capacity-building activities that strengthen the Indigenous arts community.

(Deadline: Sep. 15th)



ARTS INFRASTRUCTURE GRANTS

Supports new and emerging artists aiming to strengthen their long-term artistic practice. This program provides up to \$2,500 as a one-time grant to acquire tools and equipment or to improve personal studios or other facilities.

(Deadline: Aug. 1st)

artsnb grants and scholarships are available to professional artists and arts students residing in New Brunswick.

OUR PROGRAMS ARE DESIGNED TO ENCOURAGE AND REWARD EXCELLENCE IN ALL ARTISTIC DISCIPLINES.

Applications are evaluated by a jury of peers on the artistic merit of the proposed project or activity and on the achievements of the applicant to date.
