Distribution by artistic discipline

The number of applications submitted per discipline for this competition of the Career Development Program is as follows: 0 in architecture, 4 in craft, 3 in dance, 4 in literary arts, 8 in media arts, 3 in multidisciplinary arts, 11 in music, 3 in theatre, and 13 in visual arts. Additional funding for Professional Development grants, through the Career Development program, is provided through a pilot project supported by the Department of Postsecondary Education, Training and Labour (PETL).

The Career Development program provides financial assistance to professional artists wishing to enhance their practice through travel, study, and promotion. This flexible program has four (4) separate components: Arts by Invitation, Artist in Residence, Professional Development, and Professionalization and Promotion.
