Grants awarded for March 15, 2023, Competition – Equinox Program for Indigenous Artists

May 18, 2023, Fredericton – The New Brunswick Arts Board (artsnb) has released the results of the March 15, 2023, competition for the Equinox Program. A total of **nine (9)** grants were awarded, amounting to **\$ 39,773**. The funds are distributed as follows:
