# Distribution by artistic discipline

The number of applications submitted per discipline for this competition of the Career Development Program is as follows: 1 in architecture, 4 in craft, 5 in dance, 8 in literary arts, 5 in media arts, 2 in multidisciplinary arts, 6 in music, 9 in theatre, and 22 in visual arts. New funding for Artist in Residence grants is provided by the Department of Tourism, Heritage, and Culture (THC). Additional funding for Professional Development grants is provided through a pilot project supported by the Department of Postsecondary Education, Training, and Labour (PETL).

The Career Development program provides financial assistance to professional artists wishing to enhance their practice through travel, study, and promotion. This flexible program has four (4) separate components: Arts by Invitation, Artist in Residence, Professional Development, and Professionalization and Promotion. The New Brunswick Arts Board is an arm's length arts funding agency with a legislated mandate to facilitate and promote the creation of art as well as administering funding programs for professional artists in the province.
