The New Brunswick Arts Board is an arm's length arts funding agency with a legislated mandate to facilitate and promote the creation of art as well as administering funding programs for professional artists in the province.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Deadlines: May 1, July 1, September 1, November 1, January 1, and March 1

This program is divided into 3 components:

Arts by Invitation: to present your work – up to \$3,000 for travel and accommodation.

- Professional Development: for the enhancement of your artistic practice -\$2.000 for part-time studies or mentorships or \$3.000 for full-time studies.
- Professionalization & Promotion: to produce tools related to the promotion of your work and career – up to \$2,000 for professional services to enhance visibility and dissemination of the artist's works.

ARTIST IN RESIDENCE

Deadlines: May 1, July 1, September 1, November 1, January 1, and March 1

This program is divided into 2 components:

1. Artist in Residence - Artists: to participate in residency opportunities in New Brunswick or abroad up to a maximum of \$10,000. Artists may also submit an application for residency opportunities in Quebec as per an agreement with the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec – up to a maximum of \$10,000.

Artist in Residence - Host Organizations:

\$10,000 for projects of up to 12 months (the funding level for for-profit organizations and institutions is up to 50% of the budget, as hosting party must contribute at least 50% of costs).

> ARTS SCHOLARSHIPS Deadline: February 1

For students who plan to pursue a career in the arts. Awards are \$2,500 for full-time or \$1.000 for part time or short-term studies.



Artists who demonstrate more than 5 years of activity as a professional artist can receive up to \$20,000.

DOCUMENTATION Deadlines: April 1 and October 1

Designed to provide assistance to New Brunswick arts professionals and professional artists for the research, development, and execution of original documentation and contextualization (written, film, video, multimedia) of arts activities, arts products, or art history. The maximum grant amount for this program is \$10,000.

Intended to allow artists to devote some or most of their time to research and creative production of new work.

demonstrate up to 5 years of activities as a professional artist can receive

EQUINOX PROGRAM FOR INDIGENOUS ARTISTS Deadlines: September 15 and March 15

Supports Indigenous artists, curators, and groups to engage in the research and development for the creation of new works, in the creation and presentation of artistic work, and in the development of activities that support and strengthen the Indigenous arts community. This program offers grants with maximum amounts of \$10,000.

ARTS INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT FOR NEW AND EMERGING ARTISTS

Deadline: August 1

A project-based program for new and emerging artists designed to provide a one-time capital purchase of up to \$3.000 for the acquisition of equipment.

> ACCESSIBILITY AND EQUITY The Access Support and

Application Assistance programs offer supplementary funding to artists who identify specific barriers to carrying out their proposed activities, or within the application process itself.
