Grants awarded for September 15, 2025 Deadline – Equinox Program for Indigenous Artists

Fredericton, November 5, 2025 – The New Brunswick Arts Board (**artsnb**) has released the results of the September 15, 2025 deadline for the Equinox Program for Indigenous Artists. **Eleven (11)** grants were awarded by a jury composed of professional Indigenous artists, totaling **\$100,006.65**.

3 out of 11 recipients (27.3%) had never previously received a grant from artsnb.

The number of applications evaluated per discipline for this program deadline are as follows: 0 in architecture, 6 in craft, 0 in dance, 2 in literary arts, 2 in media arts, 6 in multidisciplinary arts, 2 in music, 0 in theatre, and 2 in visual arts.

The New Brunswick Arts Board is an arm's length arts funding agency with a legislated mandate to facilitate and



promote the creation of art as well as administering funding programs for professional artists in the province.

Funding for these programs is provided through the province's Arts Development Trust Fund and by the
Department of Tourism, Heritage and Culture. The department also provides additional funding to the Artist in
Residence program, as a response to the recommendations from the report of Premier's Task Force on the Status
of the Artist.
